

TALKING TO CLIENTS

When Making A Referral:

I recommend you and your family consider attending the Behavioral Intervention program at Tuesday's Child. They work with the whole family to improve the behavior of your child. Their evidence-based program has helped thousands of family's like yours.

I understand that they provide parent training and I don't need that:

Tuesday's Child works with parents to provide practical behavior management techniques that you can implement at home and share with your preschool/child's teacher. They believe in working with the whole family to address behavioral issues.

Are you saying I'm a bad parent:

Absolutely not. While there is a parent training component, no bad parent would ever go to Tuesday's Child. The real purpose of the program is to help you understand new, more effective ways for your family to communicate and improve family life.

I don't see behavior issues at home, so this must be a school issue:

Challenging behaviors can demonstrate themselves in different ways in different settings. The great thing about Tuesday's Child is that their techniques generalize into the school setting to help improve behavior there as well. If you continue to see challenges they can also provide direct support to school staff based on his/her individualized needs.

Is there something wrong with my child? Are you saying he/she is special needs?

I'm not saying that. What we really need to address are the behavioral issues. If something else may be going on I believe Tuesday's Child could help identify any particular challenges and provide other areas of support that your family may need. My concern is that he/she is successful.
